Cory Van Groningen, VG Meats, Simcoe, Ontario

Cory has been the co-owner of the family business, VG Meats, for over 10 years. Cory, his wife Heidi and their three daughters operate a 400 head cow-calf operation (Hillview Farm) where all cattle are marketed through their family business retail stores. Cory and Heidi were awarded the 2012 Ontario's Outstanding Young Farmer Award and Cory sits on numerous boards representing the beef industry including Beef Farmers of Ontario, the Ontario Independent Meat Processors (OIMP), Beef Improvement Opportunities (BIO) and the Haldimand Cattlemen's Association.

Dr. John Basarab, Senior Beef Research Scientist – Government of Alberta and Professor- U of Alberta

As senior research scientist with Alberta Agriculture, Dr Basarab has over 25 years of experience in beef cattle production and management. His current areas of work include improving feed efficiency, delivering genomic and producer technologies to the beef industry.

Lance Bishop, Baxter's Harbour, NS

Lance and his wife Kathleen operate Wild Mountain Farm near Wolfville. They have developed a niche market for selling grass-fed beef and other farm products through the web and at the Wolfville Farmers market. They also make weekly deliveries to customers in the Halifax area.

Vernon Campbell, Kensington, PEI

Vernon and his wife Bertha operate a large dairy, beef and potato farm. He currently farms 2,200 acres of land growing potatoes, barley, soybean, corn, oats and forages. His feedlot has a 200 head capacity and this includes raising all his own dairy bull calves from his 65 cow dairy herd. In 1993 Vernon and his wife Bertha were honoured nationally as Canada's Outstanding Young Farmers.

Nicholas Budd, Debec, New Brunswick

Located near Debec in Carlton county, Katahdin View Farm was started by Kevin and Patti Budd in 1994. Calving approximately 225 cows with a mixture of purebred Red Angus, Gelbvieh and a commercial herd of an F1 cross of the two. His Farm consists of 1000 acres owned, 300 acres rented pasture and 200 acres rented crop land. Nicholas has been fulltime on the farm since graduating from high school in 2003.

Dr. Yuri Montanholi, Chair of Beef Cattle Research, Dalhousie University, Truro, NS

This very enthusiastic researcher has several interesting and practical research trials ongoing in the Maritimes and will discuss his findings with regards to feed efficiency, nutrition, genetics and reproduction.
